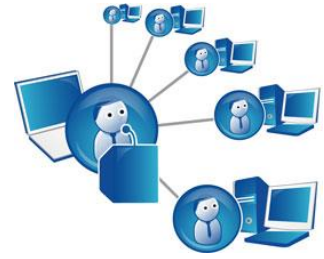

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Starting Tuesday, August 1, 2017 uberWAV product will be available in Chicago. uberWAV was previously available in Chicago on a limited view for riders who entered in a special promo code. With the expansion, riders across Chicago can open their Uber app, tap a button on their smartphone, and get connected with a wheelchair accessible vehicle, no promo code required.

Our plan will dedicate substantial resources to bring 65 additional wheelchair accessible vehicles (WAVs) online, increasing the number of WAVs in the City of Chicago by nearly 25%.

Not only will this increase transportation options for riders with disabilities, but it will also create new opportunities for drivers who will be able to rent or lease qualifying vehicles from vehicle partners at favorable rates, allowing them to help their community in a whole new way. Uber will connect these drivers with third party organizations so they can receive the certification needed to operate accessible vehicles. Uber will also offer special incentives to WAV driver-partners and increase our investment in community outreach and marketing so that those who need a ride know that Uber is available.

We've created the promo code ISAWAV17 which will get 50 people members their next two uberWAV rides free up to \$20 each—\$2,000 in total. We'd love for you to try it out and give us your feedback.
